Do you know that. . .

- Research suggests that women engage in physical aggression against their partners as frequently as men.
- Women are 3 times more likely to be injured than men, and psychological and economic injury are also much greater for women.
- While the rate of men killed by their female partners has declined significantly in the last 25 years, the rate of women killed by their male partners has stayed about the same.
- Witnessing violence can affect a child's ability to trust, ability to learn and self control.
- Ending patriarchy and male privilege are extremely important to ending domestic violence, but there are other risk factors that must also be addressed.

From the Director

The post mark was out of state; the envelope addressed to “all the ladies helping.” The card was decorated with balloons and teddy bears, and photos of smiling girls spilled out. I didn’t recognize them. She wrote, “Hey, I just wanted to say thank you. Finally, I’m starting to feel like me again. Thanks to you all caring about a perfect stranger, my precious little girls now have their Mommy back and are very happy. We have our lives back!” The name wasn’t familiar. I quickly inventoried the recent clients whose stories I was familiar with. The one where we raced to get her out late at night before the abuser came back home? The week in the hotel under the assumed name? The out-of-state temporary protective order whose husband had made repeated creepy calls to our hotline?

We’ve had so many calls lately, so many people needing help. No, the staffer who showed me the card explained, this woman called our hotline a few times as she grew worried about her abuser’s escalating rage. She spoke to a couple different people. The last time she called in a panic, desperate to get out. In one hectic afternoon, staff coordinated the escape for this woman we’d never met: arranging pick up by the police and loaning them car seats for the ride, finding a shelter out of state near her parents with bed space for her and her two girls, paying bus fare, and providing food and supplies for the overnight trip.

I wanted to hear more—to savor the card and the pictures and the thought of her safe arrival and fresh start—but there wasn’t time. The hotline was ringing again.

Superheroes Helps Families Heal 2

Superheroes is a therapeutic support and education group for children that have been affected by domestic violence. Studies show that male children who witness domestic violence are 3 times more likely to abuse their partners as adults. Striving to provide a safe and nurturing atmosphere to enable children to share, learn and heal from domestic violence, Superheroes represents a proactive strategy to stop the cycle of abuse. Each child is paired with a volunteer who engages the child in fun, interactive activities that focus on alleviating guilt and blame, improving self-esteem, building trust and teamwork, abuse prevention, assertiveness, and self-protection. There is also a concurrent parent group that meets during the children's sessions and addresses the same themes. The group is based on the premise that a child is a "SUPERHERO" for telling about what happened to them and for being so brave.

The Superheroes Group has successfully completed its first 3 sessions which have been held throughout 2008 – 2009, with the 4th session about to begin this summer. Cumulative data from the first three sessions indicate that Superheroes is a successful intervention that helps children and families heal from domestic violence.

Almost one-third of the total children participating believed that the abuse was their fault when it was still happening. After participating in Superheroes, that number dropped in half. Over two-thirds of the children held out hope that the abuse would stop and were afraid that the abuser in their family would go to jail. Almost half of the children thought nobody could do anything to help their family.

When the abuse stopped, 63% of the children felt that people thought they were brave to talk about what was happening in their family, and 100% of the children felt that their family had gotten help. Parents agreed; 98% of them felt that their child positively benefited from participating in Superheroes Group. 97% of parents felt that Superheroes met or exceeded their expectations, and 98% reported that they would recommend Superheroes Group to another family.
