- 50% of all American women are likely to be abused by partners in their lifetime.
- In homes where partner abuse occurs, children are 1500 times more likely to be abused.
- A married woman is 5 times more likely to be attacked by her partner than by a total stranger.
- Every 15 seconds a woman is beaten by her partner or ex-partner
- Arresting a batterer significantly reduces the chances he will repeat his offense.

From the Director

In the last three months, Project Safe has maintained 123% occupancy at the emergency shelter and assisted 419 other victims and survivors at our outreach office. It's easy to feel inadequate as we struggle to help more people with fewer resources in these difficult times, but feedback from those we serve lets us know how we're doing. Here's what some of our recent clients had to say...

"Thanks to all. You guys have helped me get the new beginning I have been praying for for three years. I am so grateful. My confidence and security are 100% greater than they were. Just being safe and in a caring environment meant huge leaps for me."

November 6th Marks Beginning of Madison County Support Group 3

Survivors of domestic violence in Clarke County have had ready access to support groups for many years, but women living in other counties have had more difficulty attending Project Safe's support groups. In determining where to locate a new support group, we looked at the demand for services in various outlying counties. This past year in particular, has seen tremendous growth in clients from Madison County. Last year Project Safe worked with 56 outreach clients in Madison County (outreach clients are those who need our assistance, but do not need to come into the emergency shelter). In the first half of this year Project Safe has worked with 128 outreach clients from Madison County.

The Madison County Community Support Group meets the 1st and 3rd Thursday of each month thanks to a church in Ila which has generously donated space. Other area churches are providing dinner for the women and children to enjoy prior to the start of group. Dinner begins at 6:00 and group is held from 6:30—8:00. The Domestic Violence Task Force of Athens-Clarke and Oconee Counties held its annual breakfast with elected officials on October 30th at the Athens Community Council on Aging. The highlight of the event was recognition of Advocates of the Year in four categories: Volunteer, Business, Officer of the Year, Above & Beyond and Church. We celebrate and thank this year's honorees:

Volunteer

Ellen Garrison. Ellen was recognized for her work at Project Safe's thrift store. A faithful volunteer, she has helped the store become a resource for Project Safe clients and a source of income for Project Safe since it opened in 2005.

Glenda York. Initially an intern pursuing her Masters in Counseling, Glenda has since donated up to 40 hours a week providing individual counseling, support group facilitation and shelter coverage.

Business

South Athens Animal Hospital and Four Seasons Pet Resort. Both these businesses were honored for their flexibility, patience and generosity in providing veterinary care and boarding facilities for the pets of domestic violence victims.

Sgt. Sean Potter Officer of the Year

Matilda Wooden. Corporal Wooden is an invaluable resource at the Athens-Clarke County Courthouse, often assisting the Solicitor General's office with translation and always keeping an eye out for the safety of domestic violence victims.

Above & Beyond

Tangela Beard. Tangela received well deserved praise for going well out of her way to accommodate the needs of victims and survivors in her role as Legal & Community Advocate at Project Safe.

Church

Milledge Avenue Baptist Church. The church plays host to Superheroes, the weekly group for child witnesses of intimate partner violence.

Avon Foundation Awards Grant 6

Project Safe received a \$13,700 grant from the Avon Foundation to continue the Superheroes support group for child witnesses of intimate partner violence. The grant, part of Avon's "Not Seen, Not Heard, Helping Children of Domestic Violence" will enable Project Safe to offer Superheroes three times between now and next September.

Studies suggest that up to 10 million children witness some form of domestic violence annually, and research indicates that those who witness or experience domestic violence are more likely to be victims or perpetrators in adulthood. Superheroes works to end the generational cycle of abuse by giving children a chance to share their experiences, articulate their fears and feelings, and learn appropriate ways to express anger.
